Dear Mr. Burruss:-

Mr. M. G. Hege, who is interested in the wiring contract for the new building at Harrisonburg, suggested that it would be a good plan to have the State Examiner, Mr. Apperson, inspect the job before the building is *cei*led. Mr. Hege tells me that the insurance companies pay Mr. Apperson for this work, and that it would not cost the school anything, if you would take the matter up with him or through the insurance agents who carry the insurance. In case any changes are desirable, in his opinion, they could be made more easily before the building is completed. I failed to mention this matter to you in our hurried conversation of this morning.

I enclose you herewith a copy of my report of March 1st so far as it relates to the Harrisonburg School. The general comments in that report deal with the fare that is furnished the girls at the schools. giving the menu the last time I took dinner in the girls' dining room, and state what perquisites the presidents and business managers at each of the schools receive. The table attached to the report shows what receipts are credited to the State Department and what to the School Department. As I mentioned to you at the Fredericksburg meeting, the other schools

credit the Home Department only with charge for board and the medical fees, while at your school all receipts except those from the State Treasury are credited to the school or home department.
