On account of conditions at home which have made it practically impossible for me to get away at the regular time for making my summer trips, I have gotten behind with the work of checking the accounts. During the past month, however, the work has been brought down to the close of the fiscal year and during the month of July the accounts for the past year were checked over at each of the schools by the State Accountant or his assistant, Mr. Gathright.
There is attached hereto a summary of the annual statements of the

four schools.

The Treasurer's statements show that on July first all bills which were due and payable had been paid; at Harrisonburg there were outstanding accounts amounting to approximately \$200.00. At Fredericksburg, salaries and accounts payable amounted to \$2,638.94, and at Radford outstanding

bills and accounts amounted to \$4,458.24.

Under the head of miscellaneous expenditures in the school department, some explanation should be made of the alrge amounts reported at Harrisonburg, Fredericksburg and Radford. At Harrisonburg the item of \$3,665.10 does not appear on the books as a miscellaneous item, but is listed separately as a repayment of a loan for that amount borrowed by the regular term from the summer school funds to pay off bills during the summer of 1917,

Some of the items which occur only once or twice during the year were improperly charged to the miscellaneous account. Attention was called to these but as the report is always made out and forwarded to the Auditor and to the Secretary of the Board before my trip is made I have not requested any change to be made on reports already sent in. In order to reduce the total of the miscellaneous account, I have requested the Fredericksburg and Radford schools to open an account with "Grounds" to which will be charged items such as plowing, fertilizing, horse feed, blacksmith bills, and other items in connection with the garden and grounds.

It will be noted that at Radford, no receipts are reported from the Supply Room. The supply room here started in a smaller way and is run by Mr. Gilbert entirely apart from the business office of the school. He pays for supplies purchased out of the receipts from sales and the profits from the supply room have been invested year after year in new stock until this enterprise has now gotten to a position where it carries a large and

varied stock at all times.
