The Treasurer's report for July shows a balance on hand amounting to \$3321.60 and amounts due creditors Aug.lst, as follows:

The August statement shows a balance on hand Sept.lst amounting to \$1767.45. I checked over the Harrisonburg accounts on Oct.l2th and found the Treasurer's statement to agree with the books of the school. All expenditures for the month of Muly were supported by proper vouchers. The August vouchers had not at that time been arranged for my examination, but I went over the canceled checks and found a canceled check for all expenditures with the exception of the few checks which had not yet been cashed and returned by the bank. I will go over the bills in detail for which these checks were given on my next visit to the school.

I am very glad to report that in spite of the difficulties and discouragements which Dr. Burruss had during the latter part of the summer on account of the epidemic of infantile paralysis, the school has a capacity attendance, therek being about 275 girls enrolled. Dr. Burruss tells me that the dormitories are more crowded than at any time before, and that there are a number of students rooming in rented rooms with meals and laundry at the school. The attendance is considerably ahead of what it was at this time last year.
