

Dear Mr. Burruss:-

At a meeting of the Executive Committee held in Richmond Saturday I was directed to send you advice of the action taken in reference to the insurance. You will find this in the enclosed extract from the minutes of that meeting.

I was also directed to take up with you again the question of getting interest from the Banks on your deposits. I understand that your deposits, or rather, your balances, have not been large but the board thinks that you should receive interest on your average monthly balances. The Radford school received interest and the banks in Staunton are in the habit of paying interest on such accounts and none of them makes any charge for collecting checks. I would suggest that you take this matter up with your banks at once and if one of your strong banks will pay you interest I see no reason why the bank that is willing to do this should not have your entire account. It would certainly be more convenient for you. If none of them will pay interest please let me hear from you so that I can make a further report to the Board.
