## HARRISONBURG.

On November the 16th I checked over the July, August and September accounts at Harrisonburg. This did not include the summer school accounts which will be ready for audit on my mext visit. The Treasurer's statement for September shows a balance on hand amounting to \$13,193.46 of which \$1908.13 is to the credit of the building fund, \$676.16. to the credit of the Students Loan Fund, and \$10,609.17 to the credit of the general fund. The cutstanding accounts were returned as approximately \$1500.00. The item of \$214.50 charged to sundres was simply a transfer check to the building fund. The treasurer's statement agreed with the books of the school and all expenditures were supported by a voucher in proper form and amount, except that a number of checks were not in and could not be examined at the time of my last visit. They will be examined on my next trip and the bank balance verified.

The work of completing the main building has progressed to the point where they are now ready for the carpenters to begin work. The concrete floor and connection with the adjoining building has been completed and work appears to have been very well done. The extensive grading on the lawn has been down under the direction of Mr. Chaplelear with very good effect and a concrete walk has been laid from the new dormitory to the dormitory opposite it accross the lawn.

As the Board is aware the school was closed for four weeks on account of Influenza. Those who were sick at school were well taken care of in the face of many difficulties and no deaths resulted. As was to be expected an number of the girls did not return and probably will not come back until the beginning of the next term. The attendance has fallen from 299 to 265. The loss in revenue, due to closing Dr. Burruss assumes about \$4,000.00 and the net loss at about \$1500.00. This will of course affect the financial showing of the school at the end of the fiscal year.
