## HARRISONBURG.

The Treasuerer's statement for Harrisonburg shows a balance on hand April 1st amounting to \$11,722.74, of which \$8,817.95 is to the credit of the building fund, \$350.75 to the credit of the Loan Fund and the balance, amounting to \$2554.04, to the credit of the General Fund.

The amounts due creditors on April 1st, are

stated as follows:

Included in the receipt for the month were the special appropriations for buildings amounting to \$30,000, and the loan fund appropriation of \$400.00. The item of \$10,645.00 charged to Interest & Refunds represents the repayment of the loan gotten from a Harrisonburg Bank to carry on the work on the new dormitory and the discount on the notes.

On May 5th I visited the school with the members of the building committee, and went over the new dormitory. The action of the building committee is shown in the minutes of this meeting and willnbe submitted to the Board later on. After the building committee adjourned I remained over to check over the accounts for the month, and found the Treasurer's statement to agree in all respects with the books of the school, and all expenditures supported by proper vouchers.

Voucher No.2730 for \$2.85 paid a bill for a carriage to take students to one of the rural schools. At the other schools this item would have been charged to Missellaneous or Contingent, and so this item will be omitted in my statement of the traveling expenses for the month.
