MIMU ES OF A MEETING OF THE VIRGLEIA NORMAL SCHOOL BOARD held at the Farmville School，Parmeille，Va，at 11．A．14．，Jan． 20,1917 ，pursuant to notice mailed to al1．the members of the Board．

Presents Judge John $⿴ 囗 十$ prioe，Vice－President，presiding，and Messis．Locker，Shaokelfore，Mears，Preston and king． The minutcs of the moeting held septolth， 2916 were read and approved．

It wes noved，scconded and osmried that Presicent Russell be instructed not to $\$ 111$ the glen on the exmpus west of Dormitory No． 1 until the board ehall have had an opportunity to make a further examination of the grounds．

The mimutes of the meeting of the Executive comattee held Oct．lith were read for the informstion of the Board．

Judee Price stated that the Exeoutive oommittee had adopted a practice of having the school presidents submit to each member of the Executive Comittee any propesition on which Lamediata action was desired．The dectsion of the members of the comittee was then commuicated to the Fxesident through the secretary－Ruditor without any meeting having been held．He peinted out how this prectice would frequentiy save loss of time and the expense of a meetinge sind requested the Secretarymuditor to make an orel report of the action that had been taken in pursuance of this plan．

The Secretary－Auditer reported that the Executive Conmittee
（1）．Had authorized DreEurruss，under plan similar to that adopted by the boerc for the $k$ adrord School，to borrow the mone y necesaary to pay the contractors until the special builaing appropriation becomes available tarch 2 st ．

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Judge Price tencered his resignation as a member of the Executive Comittee, and on motion, duly esrried, Wr. Shackelford was clected to rill the unexplred term of Juige Prise as a member of the Executive CommLtee.

Mr.shackelford resigned as a nomber of the Pinance Committee, and on motion $\mathrm{H} r$. Hull was elected a member of the Finance comattee In the place of Mr.Shackelford.

The Board reconvened after recess for dinner, with Mr.white and Mr. Shewiake present in addition to those present at the morning session.

Intr. Burruss eque Before the luecting and prssonted a ivittous report doted fac. 20.1917, which was reciurd and filed birth the proceedings of this meeting.

First. The provision made for carrying on the work of Prof. Heatwole during his leave of absence, as set out in said report was ratified and approved.

Second. The employment of an instructor in penmanship as set out in said report was approved for the year.

Third. The installation of 2 additional fire hydrants as reported was ratified and approved.

Fourth. It was moved, seoonced and carried that the First Rational Bank of Harel.sonburg the Rockingham National Bank and The Peoples Bank of Harrisonburg be named as depositories of the Harrisonburg school funds.
Frith. No action wee take on the Eth 1 item of ald report referring to a crack in tho terrazo floor of the $k i t c h e n$, and other matters.

Sixth. It was moved and carried that Dr. Burruss be authorized to make the purchases of furniture, etc. ss outlined in the sixth item of his report, except that he be requested to purchase single beds instead of double deckers, if he finds it practicable to 00 so.

It was moved and carried that Dr.Eurruss be authorized to pay the discount on the notes representing money borrowed to pay the contractors for morin on the new dormitory, out of the general rain tenance funds of the school.

Dr. McConnell came before the meeting and suggested that the Auditor be requested to pay the special appropriations to each of the schools as soon as possible.

It was moved and carried that Mr . Shewnake be requested to see the Auditor of Public Accounts and ask that the special appropriation for buildings and improvements at the Harrisonburg and Redford Schools be paid as soon as pogesible after March, list, 1917.

Th was moved, seconded and carried that the charge for board and washing at all of the tHermal Schools be increased from $\$ 15.00$ to 17.00 per month, beginning with the next regular sass ion.

It was moved that Drofussell and DroEurruss be authorised to pay the fees for school memberships in the Chambers of com ere of their respective cities，the fee in Procoricksburg being $\$ 25.00$ per year，and in Harrisonburg $\$ 2.00$ per year，which motion was duly carried．

Dr．lleconnell brought up for discussion the Smithoilughes Act by which certain funds frem the Federal government will be available to the State of Virginia for the purpose of aiding Trocational training in household arts，etc．，and suggested that steps be taken to secure a part of these funds for the Normal Schools．President Russell read letters from tr，C．Q．aphis and Dr．George H．Denny on the same subject．

Mr．Shemmake moved that committee of three be appointed by the Chair to act in cooperation with the four school presidents in securing information about the Smitheyughes Act and to take such action as they think proper to secure a part of the funds provided for the Normal Schools，which motion was duly secnnced and carried．

As members of the committee provided for in the above motion， the President of the Board appointed Messes．Shermeke，Locker and King．

At the invitation of the Board，Hx，C，G．周aphis of the University of virginia addressed the meeting on the subject of the SmitheHughes Act．

On motion the meeting adjourned．
