My dear Mr Burruss:- I was very glad indeed to have your letter of recent date. and in reply will say that I am sorry that it is impossible to send you the check for our dues in connection with the Presbyterian Church at present. I am wondering whether the amount includes the new subscription made a few weeks before we left. I wonder whether I am expected to pay the amount subscribed for the present year (1918). Will you be good enough to let me know about this. I think I can send you a check in the course of thirty days. Just now we are getting located in a house and I find that my bank account would not permit of a check at present..

We are delighted with the prospect of getting settled in Athens as our home. I am pleased with my work and think I am getting along very well. I have heard both from the students and members of the faculty some very complimentary remarks about my work. Just at present I am on a committee of three appointed by the Chancellor to examine the theses and the man coming up for the masters degree. I have been very much interested in this work for it is the first work of this kind I have ever been called on to do.

At present I am teaching classes in Psychology, Social Aspects of Education, and Rural Education-nine hours per week. The class in Psychology has about forty young men in it, and I am enjoying it very much indeed. I have been getting some keen class work though it is somewhat different for the classes at Harrisonburg

I have been doing some work of inspecting High Schools for Dr Stewart and was notified a few days ago that I was expected to attend the meeting of the Ga. Education Assoc. at Savannah the last of this month. I will teach here in the Summer session during July. I have nothing to do as yet for August I wish I could get some work of some kind during that month. I guess your faculty is made up for August.


